Development of the Strategy for Socio-Economic Development of Tatarstan Republic till 2030.

In cooperation with Ministry for Economy of Tatarstan Republic

The strategy "Tatarstan-2030" is being developed on behalf of Rustam Minnikhanov, President of Tatarstan, by consortium led by "International

Centre for Social and Economic Research" Leontief Centre" (with participation of an Investment and Consulting company AV Group, LLC "Laboratory of Urban Planning", Independent Center of Sociological Research, the Independent Institute for Social Policy, Audit and Consulting company EY, Research Institute of Nomur) together with the government of Tatarstan. The final goal of strategy is development of the economy, adequate to XXI century and integrated into the global economic system.

During October-November 2014, series of events to discuss the developed strategic documents have been held:

- October 1, in Kazan a strategic session interdisciplinary project site "Development of Oil and Gas Complex" was hosted;
- October 3 was a project seminar area "Innovation, Information and Technology";
- October 21 25: expert seminars and project sites: Natural Resources; the development of oilgaschemical complex; the development of Almetyevskaya and Kama economic zones;
- October 28 within the framework of the XIII All-Russian Forum "Strategic planning in the regions and cities of Russia: Revisioning strategies, Renewing meanings" (St. Petersburg) there was a round table "Priorities of the development strategy of the Tatarstan Republic ", which was attended by members of the Expert Council of "Tatarstan-2030", heads of ministries of the Republic of Tatarstan, as well as experts of the project.
- November 14, Kazan hosted a conference "Tatarstan-2030: human capital for the economy
 of the future", which was devoted to the discussion of the first edition of socio-economic
 development of the Tatarstan Republic till 2030. The conference was attended by members
 of the State Council of the Republic of Tatarstan, government members, representatives of
 the largest companies Republic and policymakers;

At the end of 2014 the first edition of the Strategy, revised in the light of comments and suggestions was handed over to the main customer.

The specific object is to construct a model describing the relationship of the quality of infrastructure in the region and its individual elements with the level of development of the industry. In the first phase of the study it is planned to construct a model that includes only variables as indicators of transport infrastructure. In the second phase it is expected to receive a

model with a lot of variables that characterize the other components of the regional infrastructure: engineering, information, market.

A. R. Batchayev "The major factors defining opportunities and results of social and economic development of regions and municipalities of Russia"

Structural reforms for stimulation of growth of regional economy: experience of Russia and Germany. The collection of scientific articles / Under the editorship of L. P. Sovershayeva. – SPb.: Skifiya-print, 2014. – Page 20-22.

This article shows the essence of factors, defining the impact on the development of the Russian regions and the cities. The author considers distinctions between external and internal factors, analysis approaches. The article states that the factors differ on degree of orientation and influence on the specific region or municipality. The theses and conclusions provided in article are supported with examples of factors for strategic planning and conceptual documents development in St. Petersburg and the Leningrad region.



A. R. Batchayev, Boris Zhikharevich "St. Petersburg during the Post-Soviet period: economic strategy and development"//

Economic and social changes: facts, tendencies, forecast No. 4 (34), 2014. – Page 68-83.

The article is devoted to the main results and features of development of St. Petersburg economy during the Post-Soviet period. The purpose of this work was to define the impact of city planning on the development of St. Petersburg during this period. As a result, seven key stages in development of the city economy for the last 22 years, and also four stages of development of system of socio-economic planning are allocated. Following these results, the authors came to the conclusion that program-planning documents turnover cycle and and changes in the approaches to state planning are more likely to come from the outside of St. Petersburg and are connected with the external conditions. Development of the city strategic, conceptual and other program and planned documents renders still not really great influence on a development of the city.



Andrey Zaostrovtsev, the book "About development and underdevelopment: how economists explain history?" has published (SPb. Publisher - European University in St. Petersburg, 2014. - 248 p., ISBN 978-5-94380-180-8).

The book reveals and compares concepts of economists to explain the course of history, nature, progress and backwardness of countries and peoples. In this book presented views of Douglass North and his co-authors, Daron Acemoglu and James Robinson, Deepak Lal, Ludwig von Mises and his followers, Deirdre McCloskey. This panorama of economic thought provides a look at the issues raised from various points of view. Author adhered to principle of impartiality in his presentation. The authors, presented in the book, focus mainly on disclosure of puzzle of modern economic growth, which is not more than 200 years. What made humanity much richer today than two centuries ago? Why this growth started initially in Western Europe and USA? What sets the pace today? What is the reason of differences in countries development level? Is there a way out of underdevelopment? Solving these and many other similar questions, the authors offer a universal concepts, that reveal from their view the entire course of human hitory. As a result, you can see how economists explain history. The book is written for economists and for all researchers in the social sciences. It will be useful to teachers of social sciences and students of these disciplines.

Reading it will give much food for thought to anyone who is interested in history and global issues of our time.



Andrey Zaostrovtsev "Economist about history: Deydra Makkloski's concept"//in

Economy Questions No. 12 2014 magazine, p. 129-145

Article analyzes the view on history and progress of mankind presented in recent basic researches of Deydra Makkloski. The emphasis is put on his distinctive non-materialistic approach to the source of historical. Also coincidence of views of the author with the ones of Ludwig von Mises is highlighted. The first part of article deals with the polemics of Makkloski, featuring almost every known concept, explaining the rise of the Western world to the economic growth and welfare. The second part covers her own theory connecting this break with radical change of the rhetoric which recognizes "bourgeois virtues" and bourgeoisie advantage. And finally, attention is focused on the fact that accoding to Makkloski's, history is neither predefined, nor irreversible.

Andrey Zaostrovtsev "Douglas Nort about culture and historical development".

The review of views of Douglas Nort of process of historical development and role of culture in this process is presented in article. Its views on belief, formal and informal institutes, the organizations reveal. Nort's positions stated in his work "Understanding of process of economic changes" (2005) and the collective monograph with its participation "Violence and social orders" (2009) are compared. The conclusion about "two Nortakh" is drawn: in the first of works it puts forward for a role of the determining factors of process of economic changes of belief and institutes as components of the concept "culture"; in the second belief are considered as part of institutes, and the culture remains out of sight of authors, being replaced with violence as object of research when studying social orders.

D. V. Kadochnikov "Political and ideological arguments in discussions on the need of international financial and economic coordination during the period between two World Wars".

Article is devoted to evolution of methodology and ideology of economic science and economic policy during the perioud between the two Wars. How was international economic cooperation justified in the early 1920s? What were the end goals of this cooperation? Why was there a fundamental in the understanding of the purposes of international cooperation in the 1930s?

Nina Oding "Establishment of property institution and management of state property in Russia".

The goal of this article is to consider interrelation of a private property institution, the state and a state property in Russia. The author analyzes the features of formation of a private property institution in Russia caused by the previous development and observed in daily practice. Rather short and interrupting period of the private-ownership relations development in Russia defined not only the weakness of institute of property which is shown in disrespect of the rights, absence of the specification and protection of ownership rights, but also inefficient functioning of a public sector of economy and management of state-owned property including the land.

Information about the diffusion of the administrative innovation of strategic planning in Russian cities and towns with over 100 000 inhabitants in 1997-2013 has been collected and analyzed. The study covered 174 cities where official documents on long-term socioeconomic planning. The collected databank of 130 documents shows the dynamics and territorial scope of the process. The main results of the study are as follows: (1) Cities with long-term strategies make up 60% of the analyzed total. (2) In 1997-2005, number of cities with long-term strategies was growing slowly, but in 2006, the growth sharply accelerated after the completion of reforms in municipal self-governance. (3) The territorial diffusion of the innovation followed the center-to-periphery law, i.e., its en masse diffusion was affected by administrative factors and diffusion in any federal districts accelerated after the strategy was adopted by the district capitals. (4) The most rapid adoption of strategic planning was observed in cities with over 250000 inhabitants. (5) There is a direct relation between a city's success manifested as the absence of a decrease in population and the adoption of strategic urban planning.

Regional economy – theory and practice. 2014. No. 41 (368). Page 47-60 Differentiation of regions based on economic and social development is one of serious management problems in Russia. Identification of the reasons and manifestations of such distinction will give to researchers and public authorities' necessary information for their work. Here the authors review integrated indicators of regions' real economy on the basis of subtest linear combination method.

"Investment attractiveness and real economy of Russian regions"

The importance of attracting investments in the economy of the country and the region is difficult to overestimate. Rise in the standard of living of the population (through the creation of new work places), the increase in the scale of the real sector and other effects of investments in the region result in improving regional infrastructure, which, in turn, improves the investment attractiveness of the region. However, the real data check is of considerable interest – weather the described regularity and the assessment of the degree of mutual influence are always observed in the Russian economy. For the purpose of this test and evaluation in this paper, a comparison of the data on the investment attractiveness of Russian regions with the assessment of the dynamics of development of the real sector in these regions has been made. It can be said that the hypotheses advanced in the beginning of the article have been confirmed, although not in full. Most regions that had unfavorable investment climate at the beginning of the years 2000 showed low integral indices of the real sector performance in subsequent years.
